TOWN BOARD MEETING**

Approved Minutes

Monday-December 13th, 2021

- Chairman Wiese called the meeting to order at 7:00PM
- The Pledge of Allegiance was recited
- Roll call of officers: Chairman Wiese, Supervisor Martello, Treasurer Allen & Clerk Linden were present. Supervisor Tomaszewski absent.
- First public forum-brief concerns or questions: Margaret Powell expressed her gratitude for help the poll workers received from the Board and other town workers during the 2020 elections.
- Approval of Vouchers-There was a Wiese/Martello motion to approve the vouchers. Motion carried.
- The Treasurer's report for November 2021 shows an opening balance at Tomahawk Community Bank of \$322,353.87. November deposits of \$8,708.00 withdraws of \$29,263.27 with an ending balance of \$301,798.60 This balanced with the Clerk's records and the Bank. Wiese/Martello motioned to accept into records. Motion carried.
- Minute's approval for the November 8th, 2021 Public Budget Hearing/Special Electors and regular town board meeting. Wiese/Martello motioned to accept the minutes into record. Motion carried.
- Correspondence: Clerk received calls regarding vehicles parked in front of the Property on Mable Highlands Frontage Rd- no ordinance exists for parking regulations. Chairman Wiese advised any further complaints to be sent to Lincoln Cty or Tomahawk Sherriff Dept.

OLD BUSINESS

- Callahan Road Property and Shorewood Circle Property Updates—Supervisor Tomaszewski was not present, but will advise any updates at the next town meeting.

NEW BUSINESS

- Possible purchase of Delinquent Tax Property- Board members Wiese/Martello motioned to go forward with the purchase of the property adjacent to Town Hall. Town of King's request will be heard at the Lincoln County Forestry meeting in January.
- Approval of the purchase of new truck for the Town of King. Martello/Wiese motioned to approve the expenditure and voucher. Motion was carried.
- Approval was signed and Motion was made -to approve the Lincoln County Shoreline Ordinance Amendment for the DNR to regulate shoreline stabilization practices going forward.
- Chief Election Inspectors were sworn in for the upcoming 2022 Elections. Margaret Powell and Pamela Hatina were present and took the oath- with the other workers to be sworn in at a later date.
- Recycling Date of December 25<sup>th</sup> changed to December 26<sup>th</sup>- new notice of recycling materials will be posted.**
